



## ELECTIVE CHOICE INFORMATION

### LOWER AND MIDDLE CAMP (GRADES 3-8)

**Our 2010 elective choice program is organized around major activities areas. Please choose wisely; these electives are assigned for the entire three and a half week session.**

- Some electives may require parental/guardian permission. If you are considering one of these electives, please make sure that you provide us with the appropriate forms and signatures.
- The form for selecting your electives is separated by departments. Please select your top ten choices from 1 - 10, with one being your first choice. You may select electives from any department.
- Bunk activity periods such as daily swim lessons, general arts & crafts, boating and canoeing, Jewish culture, shira (singing), rikud (Israeli dancing) and nature represent part of the remainder of your weekly schedule.
- Every attempt will be made to schedule your top elective choices. **We urge each family to work together with their campers to make choices based on their interests. We suggest that you make a copy of the electives that you are sending to us.**
- Waterskiing, sailing, and windsurfing are limited to campers who have passed **THE AMERICAN RED CROSS SWIMMING LEVEL 3**. Campers who sign up for these electives and who do not pass the Camp Pembroke endurance test will be assigned to their next elective choice. Due to the high demand for water sports, campers who request a second water activity will be assigned to it only if space is available. **Please fill out and return the Waterskiing Permission Form** by June 5.
- All campers enrolled in the drama elective will be involved in a production at the end of each session.
- Ice Skating is available for grades 3<sup>rd</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup> as an outside camp activity. If you are planning to participate in this activity, please be sure to return the **appropriate Release and Permission Form**, (2 separate forms) along with a check payable to **CAMP PEMBROKE**.
- Horseback Riding is available for grades 5<sup>th</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup> as an outside activity. If you are planning to participate in this activity, please be sure to return the **appropriate Permission Form**, along with a check payable to **CAMP PEMBROKE**. Campers may choose only one outside camp activity.
- Golf is available for grade 7<sup>th</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup> as an outside activity. If you are planning to participate in this activity, please be sure to return the **appropriate Permission Form**, along with a check payable to **CAMP PEMBROKE**. Campers may choose only one outside camp activity.
- All campers who wear protective goggles, mouth guards, shin guards or cleats for athletic activities should bring these items to camp.
- Campers in grades 3 – 8 will be given their elective schedules **on the first day** of camp for each session.
- All season campers will fill out a second session **elective choice form** during the first session.
- **ELECTIVES ARE ASSIGNED ON A FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED BASIS.**

## UPPER CAMP (GRADES 9 – 10)

- The 2010 Elective Guide is designed and organized alphabetically by departments and activities. Upper Campers (9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> graders) will once again select their own electives at camp. Please choose carefully; these electives are assigned for the entire three and a half week session. Come to camp ready to make choices based on your interests. Waterskiing, biking and lifeguarding require parental/guardian permission. Please make sure, if you are considering one of these electives that you provide us with the appropriate forms and signatures before camp.
- Waterskiing, sailing, and windsurfing are limited to campers who have passed **THE AMERICAN RED CROSS SWIMMING LEVEL 3**. Campers who sign up for these electives and who do not pass the Camp Pembroke endurance test will be assigned to their next elective choice. Please fill out and return the Waterskiing Permission Form no later than **June 5**.
- Lifeguarding will be offered for any camper in 10<sup>th</sup> grade and turning 15 years old before August 18, 2010. **An additional fee will be charged for this course**. You must be a full season camper to take lifeguarding. Please fill out and return the Lifeguarding Permission Form no later than **June 5**.
- All campers enrolled in the drama elective will be involved in a production at the end of each session. Drama is a double period elective and your schedule will be changed accordingly.
- Golf, horseback riding and ice skating are available as outside camp activities. If you are planning to participate in any of these electives, please be sure to return the appropriate Registration and Permission Forms along with a check payable to **CAMP PEMBROKE by June 5**.
- All campers who wear protective goggles, mouth guards, shin guards or cleats for athletic activities should bring these items to camp.
- Overnight information and permission forms will be sent separately.
